Catch a glimpse of 'The Future of Higher Education'

Carthage, UW system presidents will conduct a fireside chat April 18

KENOSHA, Wis. – Community members are invited to join the audience at Carthage College on Thursday, April 18, for a fireside chat about higher education's role in building the workforce of the future.

Hear insights about "The Future of Higher Education" from two prominent educational leaders: Carthage President John Swallow and Jay Rothman, president of the Universities of Wisconsin. This event begins with a luncheon at 11:30 a.m., followed by the discussion from noon to 1 p.m.

The Carthage Business and Professional Coalition is hosting the event at the college's campus, 2001 Alford Park Drive. Although admission to the lunch and program is free, all attendees must register in advance.

Greg Berg, a Carthage faculty member who has conducted thousands of interviews as host of "The Morning Show" on public radio station WGTD, will moderate the conversation. The two presidents will preview the higher ed innovations that will help to shape economic development in southeastern Wisconsin.

Since taking office in 2017, Swallow has led an educational evolution at Carthage, guiding the launch of a comprehensive career development program and committing to eliminate equity gaps in graduation rates by 2030. A past chair of the Higher Education Regional Alliance, he now serves on the Leadership Council of the Metropolitan Milwaukee Association of Commerce.

Hired as president of the UW system in 2022, Rothman oversees a network of 13 Wisconsin public universities and a statewide extension network. Recently rebranded as the Universities of Wisconsin, the system awards nearly 37,000 degrees each year.

Guided by a steering committee of civic and business leaders, the Business and Professional Coalition has convened at Carthage for nearly 30 years to exchange ideas that support the region's economy. Proceeds from coalition sponsorships go to Carthage's Ralph Tenuta Experiential Learning Fund, which benefits Carthage's comprehensive career development sequence, The Aspire Program.
